Sermon Reflections & Activities: Daily questions and activities based on the past week's sermon. Level 1 children can draw, while Level 2 (older children) and Level 3 (teens/adults) discuss the text together.

Worship Song: Prepare for worship by learning one stanza per week, including hand motions for young children.

Memory Verse: A new scripture passage tied to the sermon series every four weeks. Aim to memorize roughly one verse each week.

Proverbs 9:8-11

**⁸Do not reprove a scoffer, or he will hate you;
reprove a wise man, and he will love you.**

**⁹Give instruction to a wise man, and he will be still wiser;
teach a righteous man, and he will increase in learning.**

**¹⁰The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom,
and the knowledge of the Holy One is insight.**

**¹¹For by me your days will be multiplied,
and years will be added to your life.**

Weekly Bible Reading: Follow a 3-year chronological plan (5 chapters/week) to build reading habits and align with Sunday School (The Gospel Project) topics.

This Week: **Proverbs 27; Psalms 69, 70, 71, 72**

Sunday: Matthew 9:35 And Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages, teaching... proclaiming the gospel... and healing every disease and every affliction.

- Level 1 — Draw Jesus visiting many different towns and helping people.
- Level 2 — What three things did Jesus spend His time doing?
- Level 3 — What does Jesus' ministry teach us about balancing truth, compassion, and action?

Monday: Matthew 9:36 When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd.

- Level 1 — Draw a shepherd caring for lost sheep.
- Level 2 — Why did Jesus feel compassion for the crowds?
- Level 3 — What keeps us from seeing people with the same compassion Jesus had?



Tuesday: Matthew 9:10-13 And as Jesus reclined at table in the house, behold, many tax collectors and sinners came and were reclining with Jesus and his disciples. ¹¹And when the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, “Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?” ¹²But when he heard it, he said, “Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. ¹³Go and learn what this means: ‘I desire mercy, and not sacrifice.’ For I came not to call the righteous, but sinners.

- Level 1 — Draw Jesus eating a meal with people.
- Level 2 — Why do you think the Pharisees were so angry about Jesus eating with sinners?
- Level 3 — How might you be able to spend intentional time with the lost within your proximity?

Wednesday: Matthew 28:18-20 And Jesus came and said to them, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in] the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.

- Level 1 — Draw a picture of the world with people surrounding it.
- Level 2 — What is both challenging and encouraging about the great commission?
- Level 3 — What do you think your “next step” is to live in light of Jesus commission to make disciples?

Thursday: Matthew 9:37 The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few.

- Level 1 — Draw a large field ready to be harvested.
- Level 2 — What do you think Jesus means by “the harvest”?
- Level 3 — Why do you think there are often fewer workers than opportunities to share the gospel?

Friday: Matthew 9:38 Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.

- Level 1 — Draw people praying together.
- Level 2— Why does Jesus tell His disciples to pray before telling them to go?
- Level 3 — ho are 1-3 people you can begin praying for this week— either to know Christ or to be strengthened for gospel ministry?

Saturday: Read Proverbs 18:24

- Level 1 — Draw a picture that comes to your mind when you hear this passage.
- Level 2&3 — What questions do you have about this passage?
