Sermon Reflections & Activities: Daily questions and activities based on the past week's sermon. Level 1 children can draw, while Level 2 (older children) and Level 3 (teens/adults) discuss the text together.

Worship Song: Prepare for worship by learning one stanza per week, including hand motions for young children.

Memory Verse: A new scripture passage tied to the sermon series every four weeks. Aim to memorize roughly one verse each week.

Proverbs 9:8-11

**⁸Do not reprove a scoffer, or he will hate you;
reprove a wise man, and he will love you.**

**⁹Give instruction to a wise man, and he will be still wiser;
teach a righteous man, and he will increase in learning.**

**¹⁰The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom,
and the knowledge of the Holy One is insight.**

**¹¹For by me your days will be multiplied,
and years will be added to your life.**

Weekly Bible Reading: Follow a 3-year chronological plan (5 chapters/week) to build reading habits and align with Sunday School (The Gospel Project) topics.

This Week: **Proverbs 30; Psalms 79, 80, 81, Luke 12**

Grace Presbyterian Church August 23rd - August 29th

Sunday: Proverbs 3:9-10 Honor the LORD with your wealth and with the firstfruits of all your produce; then your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will be bursting with wine.

- Level 1 — Draw a picture of someone bringing the first part of a harvest to the temple.
- Level 2 — What principle does the “firstfruits” teach us?
- Level 3 — What other areas of your life, besides your finances, might you not be giving to the Lord the “firstfruits”? What would that look like?

Monday: Proverbs 27:23 says, Know well the condition of your flocks, and give attention to your herds.

Proverbs 21:5 says, “The plans of the diligent lead surely to abundance, but everyone who is hasty comes only to poverty.

- Level 1 — Draw someone carefully counting sheep in their field.
- Level 2 — Do you know how much money you have? How do you decide what to spend money on?
- Level 3 — What is one thing God has given you that you need to manage more deliberately?

Tuesday: Proverbs 21:20 Precious treasure and oil are in a wise man’s dwelling, but a foolish man devours it.

Proverbs 13:22 A good man leaves an inheritance to his children’s children.

- Level 1 — Draw one person who uses everything immediately and another who saves some for later.
- Level 2 — Why does a wise person have money left over that he has not spent in life?
- Level 3 — How are you doing at creating financial margin in your spending so you are prepared for the future?



Wednesday: Proverbs 21:17 Whoever loves pleasure will be a poor man; he who loves wine and oil will not be rich.

- Level 1 — Draw something expensive that would be enjoyable to have.
- Level 2 — Is it wrong to enjoy good things? What danger is this proverb warning us about?
- Level 3 — How can you tell the difference between “I would enjoy this” and “I can wisely afford this”?

Thursday: Proverbs 12:9 Better to be lowly and have a servant than to play the great man and lack bread.

Proverbs 13:7 One pretends to be rich, yet has nothing; another pretends to be poor, yet has great wealth.

- Level 1 — Draw someone pretending to be richer than he really is.
- Level 2 — Why might a person pretend to make more money than he actually does? Where are you tempted in your life right now to present a better image of yourself than is true?
- Level 3 — Do you own the things you do because you can afford them, or because you can afford the payments? Why?

Friday: Proverbs 11:24 One gives freely, yet grows all the richer; another withholds what he should give, and only suffers want.

Proverbs 14:31 Whoever oppresses a poor man insults his Maker, but he who is generous to the needy honors him.

Proverbs 22:9 Whoever has a bountiful eye will be blessed, for he shares his bread with the poor.

- Level 1 — Draw someone sharing food or money with another person in need?
- Level 2 & 3 — Why is it so spiritually dangerous to equate tithing with the totality of the bible’s teaching on generosity?

Saturday: Acts 1:8

- Level 1 — Draw the world with arrows going from Jerusalem out all over the world.
- Level 2 & 3 — What questions do you have about this passage?
