GRACE FAMILY WORSHIP GUIDE

March 1st 2026

This sheet contains sermon reflections, a monthly song, a memory passage, and weekly Bible readings.

Sermon Text, Questions & Activities: Daily questions and an activity for children based on the past week's sermon. Young children (Level 1) can draw, while older children (Level 2) and teens/adults (Level 3) discuss questions.

Monthly Song: A song to prepare for an upcoming worship service with weekly hand motions to engage young children. Focus on adding one stanza per week with your family starting with the first stanza on the first week the song appears.

Memory Verse: A scripture passage connected to the sermon series for all ages to memorize monthly. Try to memorize one verse or so per week.

Weekly Bible Reading: Five chapters from a 3-year plan to enjoy Bible intake habits and prepare for our church's Sunday School (The Gospel Project) content. Following this plan allows families or individuals to read the entire Bible in three years. If you have children in Sunday School, this will support conversations. If you do not have children in Sunday School, it is a chronological reading plan that allows for about one chapter per day.

This Weeks Bible Chapters: Proverbs 5; Psalm 4,5; Matthew 1; Luke 2

Grace Presbyterian Church March st - 7th

Sunday: Acts 3:1-5 Now Peter and John were going up to the temple at the hour of prayer, the ninth hour. ²And a man lame from birth was being carried, whom they laid daily at the gate of the temple that is called the Beautiful Gate to ask alms of those entering the temple. ³Seeing Peter and John about to go into the temple, he asked to receive alms. ⁴And Peter directed his gaze at him, as did John, and said, "Look at us." ⁵And he fixed his attention on them, expecting to receive something from them.

- Level 1: Draw a big temple gate and a man sitting on the ground with people walking past him.
- Level 2&3: What goes through your mind when you see someone asking for money?

Monday: Acts 3:6-11 But Peter said, "I have no silver and gold, but what I do have I give to you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk!" ⁷And he took him by the right hand and raised him up, and immediately his feet and ankles were made strong. ⁸And leaping up, he stood and began to walk, and entered the temple with them, walking and leaping and praising God. ⁹And all the people saw him walking and praising God, ¹⁰and recognized him as the one who sat at the Beautiful Gate of the temple, asking for alms. And they were filled with wonder and amazement at what had happened to him. ¹¹While he clung to Peter and John, all the people, utterly astounded, ran together to them in the portico called Solomon's.

- Level 1: Draw the man jumping in the air with people around him looking surprised.
- Level 2: How is this a picture of what Jesus does to us spiritually?
- Level 3: How do you interpret the lack of miracles in the modern church? Why?

Tuesday: Acts 3:12-16 And when Peter saw it he addressed the people: "Men of Israel, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we have made him walk? ¹³The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our fathers, glorified his servant Jesus, whom you delivered over and denied in the presence of Pilate, when he had decided to release him. ¹⁴But you denied the Holy and Righteous One, and asked for a murderer to be granted to you, ¹⁵and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses. ¹⁶And his name—by faith in his name—has made this man strong whom you see and know, and the faith that is through Jesus has given the man this perfect health in the presence of you all.

- Level 1: Draw a big arrow pointing from the jumping man to the sky, showing that the miracle points somewhere.
- Level 2: If you performed a miracle like Peter did, how would you feel and what would you say when people gathered around to hear how it happened?
- Level 3: How does this text inform our understanding of how miracles functioned in Acts?

Wednesday: Acts 3:17-19a "And now, brothers, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did also your rulers. ¹⁸But what God foretold by the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ would suffer, he thus fulfilled. ¹⁹Repent therefore, and turn back,

- Level 1 : Draw someone walking the wrong direction with a sign that says "Turn Around!"
- Level 2: Can you think of a time you had to turn around and admit you were wrong? How did it feel?
- Level 3: Why is true repentance so difficult?

Thursday: Acts 3:19b-21 that your sins may be blotted out, ²⁰that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord, and that he may send the Christ appointed for you, Jesus, ²¹whom heaven must receive until the time for restoring all the things about which God spoke by the mouth of his holy prophets long ago.

- Level 1: Draw a heart being washed clean, and sunshine coming down from the sky.
- Level 2: How might Christians experience refreshment in life that non-Christians do not experience?
- Level 3: What is Peter suggesting must happen before the time for restoring all things?

Friday: Acts 3:22-26 Moses said, "The Lord God will raise up for you a prophet like me from your brothers. You shall listen to him in whatever he tells you. ²³And it shall be that every soul who does not listen to that prophet shall be destroyed from the people." ²⁴And all the prophets who have spoken, from Samuel and those who came after him, also proclaimed these days. ²⁵You are the sons of the prophets and of the covenant that God made with your fathers, saying to Abraham, "And in your offspring shall all the families of the earth be blessed." ²⁶God, having raised up his servant, sent him to you first, to bless you by turning every one of you from your wickedness."

- Level 1: Draw a scroll (Bible) and a crown to show promises coming true.
- Level 2: Why is it important to listen when God speaks?
- Level 3: For Peter, how relevant is the OT scripture to people in his day? Why?

Saturday: Read all of Acts 4:1-12

- Level 1: Draw men taken to jail by religious leaders.
- Level 2&3: What questions do you have about this passage?
