# GRACE FAMILY WORSHIP GUIDE

March 8th 2026

This sheet contains sermon reflections, a monthly song, a memory passage, and weekly Bible readings.

Sermon Text, Questions & Activities: Daily questions and an activity for children based on the past week's sermon. Young children (Level 1) can draw, while older children (Level 2) and teens/adults (Level 3) discuss questions.

Monthly Song: A song to prepare for an upcoming worship service with weekly hand motions to engage young children. Focus on adding one stanza per week with your family starting with the first stanza on the first week the song appears.

Memory Verse: A scripture passage connected to the sermon series for all ages to memorize monthly. Try to memorize one verse or so per week.

Weekly Bible Reading: Five chapters from a 3-year plan to enjoy Bible intake habits and prepare for our church's Sunday School (The Gospel Project) content. Following this plan allows families or individuals to read the entire Bible in three years. If you have children in Sunday School, this will support conversations. If you do not have children in Sunday School, it is a chronological reading plan that allows for about one chapter per day.

This Weeks Bible Chapters: Proverbs 6; Psalm 6,7,8,9

# Grace Presbyterian Church March 8th - 14th

**Sunday:** Acts 4:1-4 And as they were speaking to the people, the priests and the captain of the temple and the Sadducees came upon them, <sup>2</sup>greatly annoyed because they were teaching the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection from the dead. <sup>3</sup>And they arrested them and put them in custody until the next day, for it was already evening. <sup>4</sup>But many of those who had heard the word believed, and the number of the men came to about five thousand.

- Level 1: Draw Peter and John being arrested by temple guards.
- Level 2: Why do you think some people believed in Jesus even though Peter and John were arrested?
- Level 3: Where have you personally experienced opposition to the gospel message?

**Monday:** Acts 4:5-12 On the next day their rulers and elders and scribes gathered together in Jerusalem, <sup>6</sup>with Annas the high priest and Caiaphas and John and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. <sup>7</sup>And when they had set them in the midst, they inquired, “By what power or by what name did you do this?” <sup>8</sup>Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, “Rulers of the people and elders, <sup>9</sup>if we are being examined today concerning a good deed done to a crippled man, by what means this man has been healed, <sup>10</sup>let it be known to all of you and to all the people of Israel that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead—by him this man is standing before you well. <sup>11</sup>This Jesus is the stone that was rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone. <sup>12</sup>And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved.”

- Level 1: Draw a large stone labeled “Cornerstone” with smaller stones being built around it.
- Level 2: Why isn’t Jesus just “a way,” but the only way to be saved?
- Level 3: If someone asked you why Christianity is exclusive, what would you say?

**Tuesday:** Acts 4:13-14 Now when they saw the boldness of Peter and John, and perceived that they were uneducated, common men, they were astonished. And they recognized that they had been with Jesus. <sup>14</sup>But seeing the man who was healed standing beside them, they had nothing to say in opposition.

- Level 1: Draw two ordinary-looking men standing confidently before a group of important leaders.
- Level 2: How could regular, “unschooled” men be so brave?
- Level 3: Looking back on this moment do you think Peter was surprised by his boldness and clarity in this moment? Why?

**Wednesday:** Acts 4:15-18 But when they had commanded them to leave the council, they conferred with one another, <sup>16</sup>saying, “What shall we do with these men? For that a notable sign has been performed through them is evident to all the inhabitants of Jerusalem, and we cannot deny it. <sup>17</sup>But in order that it may spread no further among the people, let us warn them to speak no more to anyone in this name.” <sup>18</sup>So they called them and charged them not to speak or teach at all in the name of Jesus.

- Level 1 : Draw a group of leaders whispering together while pointing toward Peter and John.
- Level 2: Why would someone try to stop others from talking about Jesus?
- Level 3: Where do you see modern attempts to silence exclusive Christian claims, and how do you respond?

**Thursday:** Acts 4:19-20 But Peter and John answered them, “Whether it is right in the sight of God to listen to you rather than to God, you must judge, [20] for we cannot but speak of what we have seen and heard.”

- Level 1: Draw Peter speaking boldly while a speech bubble says, “We cannot stop speaking!”
- Level 2&3: Where are places or relationships that you have lacked urgency in speaking about Christ?

**Friday:** Acts 4:21-22 And when they had further threatened them, they let them go, finding no way to punish them, because of the people, for all were praising God for what had happened. <sup>22</sup>For the man on whom this sign of healing was performed was more than forty years old.

- Level 1: Draw the healed man standing tall while a crowd praises God.
- Level 2: Why couldn’t the leaders deny the miracle?
- Level 3: What impact should the resurrection have on our level of fear in sharing Christ?

**Saturday:** Read all of Acts 4:23-31

- Level 1: Draw a group of people praying.
- Level 2&3: What questions do you have about this passage?
