GRACE FAMILY WORSHIP GUIDE

March 22nd 2026

This sheet contains sermon reflections, a monthly song, a memory passage, and weekly Bible readings.

Sermon Text, Questions & Activities: Daily questions and an activity for children based on the past week's sermon. Young children (Level 1) can draw, while older children (Level 2) and teens/adults (Level 3) discuss questions.

Monthly Song: A song to prepare for an upcoming worship service with weekly hand motions to engage young children. Focus on adding one stanza per week with your family starting with the first stanza on the first week the song appears.

Memory Verse: A scripture passage connected to the sermon series for all ages to memorize monthly. Try to memorize one verse or so per week.

Weekly Bible Reading: Five chapters from a 3-year plan to enjoy Bible intake habits and prepare for our church's Sunday School (The Gospel Project) content. Following this plan allows families or individuals to read the entire Bible in three years. If you have children in Sunday School, this will support conversations. If you do not have children in Sunday School, it is a chronological reading plan that allows for about one chapter per day.

This Weeks Bible Chapters: Proverbs 8; Psalm 13, 14, 15, 16

Grace Presbyterian Church March 22nd - 28th

Sunday: 1 Timothy 6:9–10 But those who desire to be rich fall into temptation, into a snare, into many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evils. It is through this craving that some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pangs.

- Level 1: Draw a thorn tree with roots.
- Level 2: What would you do if someone gave you \$1,000? How happy would that money make you? For how long?
- Level 3: What are some of the ways that you and/or people in your community look to money to provide you with happiness and security?

Monday: 1 Timothy 6:17 As for the rich in this present age, charge them not to be haughty, nor to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, who richly provides us with everything to enjoy.

- Level 1: Draw someone with lots of money.
- Level 2&3: The Bible says that having a lot of money can make a person haughty or arrogant. Why do you think that is so?

Tuesday: Proverbs 15:16 Better is a little with the fear of the LORD than great treasure and trouble with it.

- Level 1: Draw someone who is thankful.
- Level 2: How does knowing that God loves you and promises to care for you help keep you from worry?
- Level 3: Proverbs says that a person who has a lot may actually have more worries than a person who has little. Have you experienced this?



Wednesday: Luke 12:32–34 “Fear not, little flock, for it is your Father’s good pleasure to give you the kingdom. Sell your possessions, and give to the needy. Provide yourselves with moneybags that do not grow old, with a treasure in the heavens that does not fail, where no thief approaches and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.

- Level 1 : Draw a sheep.
- Level 2: What proof do you have as a Christian that God loves you and will care for you?
- Level 3: How does believing that God loves you and cares for you enable you to live generously rather than selfishly?

Thursday: 1 Timothy 6:18–19 They are to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous and ready to share, thus storing up treasure for themselves as a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of that which is truly life.

- Level 1: Draw a lot of treasure.
- Level 2: How does believing that God loves you and cares for you enable you to live generously rather than selfishly?
- Level 3: What would it look like for you to live in full faith that you will live forever and that God will one day bless you beyond measure? How would that be different from how most people live?

Friday: Hebrews 13:5–6: Keep your life free from love of money, and be content with what you have, for he has said, “I will never leave you nor forsake you.” So we can confidently say, “The Lord is my helper; I will not fear; what can man do to me?”

- Level 1: Draw someone helping someone else.
- Level 2&3: How does understanding that the Lord will never leave us or forsake us help keep us from the love of money? How can we regularly remind ourselves of this truth?

Saturday: Matthew 21:9: And the crowds that went before him and that followed him were shouting, “Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!”

- Level 1: Level 1: Draw a baby donkey
- Level 2&3: Read the whole passage for the sermon tomorrow: Matthew 21:1-11. Put yourselves in this scene, as if you were there as a disciple. What would you notice? What thoughts or questions might arise in your mind?
