Sermon Reflections & Activities: Daily questions and activities based on the past week's sermon. Level 1 children can draw, while Level 2 (older children) and Level 3 (teens/adults) discuss the text together.

Worship Song: Prepare for worship by learning one stanza per week, including hand motions for young children.

Memory Verse: A new scripture passage tied to the sermon series every four weeks. Aim to memorize roughly one verse each week.

**Proverbs 3:5-8 Trust in the Lord with all your heart,
and do not lean on your own understanding.**

⁶ In all your ways acknowledge him,

and he will make straight your paths.

⁷ Be not wise in your own eyes;

fear the Lord, and turn away from evil.

⁸ It will be healing to your flesh

and refreshment to your bones.

Weekly Bible Reading: Follow a 3-year chronological plan (5 chapters/week) to build reading habits and align with Sunday School (The Gospel Project) topics.

This Week: **Proverbs 24; Psalms 65, Matthew 12, Psalms 66, 67**

Grace Presbyterian Church July 12th - July 18th

Sunday: Proverbs 1:1 The proverbs of Solomon, son of David, king of Israel:

- Level 1 — Draw: Draw King Solomon writing down wise sayings from God.
- Level 2 — Discuss: Why do you think it matters that Proverbs comes from someone God made wise?
- Level 3 — Discuss: How does knowing Proverbs is God's wisdom change the way we should receive it?

Monday: Proverbs 1:2 To know wisdom and instruction,
to understand words of insight,

- Level 1 — Draw: Draw a maze with one path that leads the right way and another path that leads to a dead end.
- Level 2 — Discuss: What is the difference between being smart and being wise?
- Level 3 — Discuss: Why is correction necessary if we are going to become wise?

Tuesday: Proverbs 1:3 to receive instruction in wise dealing,
in righteousness, justice, and equity;

- Level 1 — Draw: Draw someone choosing between a selfish path and a righteous path.
- Level 2 — Discuss: Can someone be successful and still foolish? Why?
- Level 3 — Discuss: How do righteousness, justice, and equity protect us from treating Proverbs like self-help?



Wednesday: Proverbs 1:4

to give prudence to the simple,
knowledge and discretion to the youth—

- Level 1 — Draw: Draw a young person listening carefully to a wise teacher.
- Level 2 — Discuss: Why do young people especially need wisdom?
- Level 3 — Discuss: Where are you still “simple” or unformed and in need of God's wisdom?

Thursday: Proverbs 1:5-6

Let the wise hear and increase in learning,
and the one who understands obtain guidance,
to understand a proverb and a saying,
the words of the wise and their riddles.

- Level 1 — Draw: Draw an older wise person still learning from God's Word.
- Level 2 — Discuss: Why does a wise person keep learning?
- Level 3 — Discuss: What is the danger of thinking you have outgrown instruction?

Friday: Proverbs 1:7 The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge;
fools despise wisdom and instruction.

- Level 1 — Draw: Draw a maze with many entrances, but one of them says “fear of the LORD.”
- Level 2&3 — Discuss: What does it mean to fear the Lord, and why is the fear of the Lord the beginning?

Saturday: Read: Proverbs 9:1-6, 13-18.

- L1: Draw a path leading to a fork in the road, with a woman standing in each path.
- L2: What questions do you have about this passage?
