Sermon Reflections & Activities: Daily questions and activities based on the past week's sermon. Level 1 children can draw, while Level 2 (older children) and Level 3 (teens/adults) discuss the text together.

Worship Song: Prepare for worship by learning one stanza per week, including hand motions for young children.

Memory Verse: A new scripture passage tied to the sermon series every four weeks. Aim to memorize roughly one verse each week.

**Proverbs 3:5-8 Trust in the Lord with all your heart,
and do not lean on your own understanding.**

⁶ In all your ways acknowledge him,

and he will make straight your paths.

⁷ Be not wise in your own eyes;

fear the Lord, and turn away from evil.

⁸ It will be healing to your flesh

and refreshment to your bones.

Weekly Bible Reading: Follow a 3-year chronological plan (5 chapters/week) to build reading habits and align with Sunday School (The Gospel Project) topics.

This Week: **Proverbs 25; Psalms 68, Matthew 5, 6, 7**

Sunday: Proverbs 9:1-2 Wisdom has built her house; she has hewn her seven pillars. ²She has slaughtered her beasts; she has mixed her wine; she has also set her table.

- Level 1 — Draw Woman Wisdom's house with seven pillars and a table full of food.
- Level 2 — What do the house, pillars, and feast tell us about what Wisdom offers?
- Level 3 — Where are you tempted to believe that following God will cause you to miss out? How does this picture challenge that belief?

Monday: Proverbs 9:3-4 She has sent out her young women to call from the highest places in the town, ⁴"Whoever is simple, let him turn in here!" To him who lacks sense she says,

- Level 1 — Draw a woman calling out to men who are unsure of where to go.
- Level 2 — What does it mean to be "simple" in Proverbs? How is it different than being a fool?
- Level 3 — What area of life currently makes you feel inexperienced or uncertain? What would keep you from actively seeking wisdom?

Tuesday: Proverbs 9:5-6 "Come, eat of my bread and drink of the wine I have mixed. ⁶Leave your simple ways, and live, and walk in the way of insight."

- Level 1 — Draw two paths. One path should lead toward Wisdom's table.
- Level 2 — What does Wisdom tell the simple person to leave? What does she promise?
- Level 3 — What foolish pattern, attitude, relationship, or habit may God be calling you to leave?



Wednesday: Proverbs 9:13-15 The woman Folly is loud; she is seductive and knows nothing. ¹⁴She sits at the door of her house; she takes a seat on the highest places of the town, ¹⁵calling to those who pass by, who are going straight on their way,

- Level 1 — Draw Woman Folly making loud noises and calling out to men passing her house.
- Level 2 — What is appealing about Woman Folly?
- Level 3 — Which loud voices in our culture make foolishness sound attractive or normal?

Thursday: Proverbs 9:16-17 Whoever is simple, let him turn in here!" And to him who lacks sense she says, ¹⁷"Stolen water is sweet, and bread eaten in secret is pleasant."

- Level 1 — Draw a table with bread and water on it that looks good on the outside, but that has poison on the inside.
- Level 2 — Why might something forbidden seem more exciting?
- Level 3 — What sins are commonly presented as harmless, private, exciting, or deserved?

Friday: Proverbs 9:18 But he does not know that the dead are there, that her guests are in the depths of Sheol.

- Level 1 — Draw two houses. Put the word LIFE over Wisdom's house and DEATH over Folly's house.
- Level 2 — List two ways the women are similar and two ways they are different. What is the significance of the similarities and differences?
- Level 3 — Which invitation have your recent choices been answering? Where do you need to reject Folly's voice and listen again to Christ?

Saturday: Read Proverbs 9:7-12

- Level 1 — Draw a scoffing face.
- Level 2&3 — What questions do you have about this passage?
