Sermon Reflections & Activities: Daily questions and activities based on the past week's sermon. Level 1 children can draw, while Level 2 (older children) and Level 3 (teens/adults) discuss the text together.

Worship Song: Prepare for worship by learning one stanza per week, including hand motions for young children.

Memory Verse: A new scripture passage tied to the sermon series every four weeks. Aim to memorize roughly one verse each week.

1 John 2:1-5a My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. ² He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world. ³ And by this we know that we have come to know him, if we keep his commandments. ⁴Whoever says "I know him" but does not keep his commandments is a liar, and the truth is not in him, ⁵ but whoever keeps his word, in him truly the love of God is perfected.

Weekly Bible Reading: Follow a 3-year chronological plan (5 chapters/week) to build reading habits and align with Sunday School (The Gospel Project) topics.

This Week: **Proverbs 18; Psalms 45, 46, 47, 48**

Sunday: Acts 6:8-14 And Stephen, full of grace and power, was doing great wonders and signs among the people. ⁹Then some of those who belonged to the synagogue of the Freedmen (as it was called), and of the Cyrenians, and of the Alexandrians, and of those from Cilicia and Asia, rose up and disputed with Stephen. ¹⁰But they could not withstand the wisdom and the Spirit with which he was speaking. ¹¹Then they secretly instigated men who said, “We have heard him speak blasphemous words against Moses and God.” ¹²And they stirred up the people and the elders and the scribes, and they came upon him and seized him and brought him before the council, ¹³and they set up false witnesses who said, “This man never ceases to speak words against this holy place and the law, ¹⁴for we have heard him say that this Jesus of Nazareth will destroy this place and will change the customs that Moses delivered to us.”

- Level 1: Draw Stephen teaching people about Jesus while some angry men argue with him.
- Level 2: How do you think Stephen felt about being misunderstood and having false witnesses twist his words?
- Level 3: If Stephen wasn't speaking blasphemous words against Moses, God, the holy place, and the law, what was he saying and how could it have been misunderstood or misrepresented?

Monday: Acts 7:2, 8 And Stephen said: “Brothers and fathers, hear me. The God of glory appeared to our father Abraham when he was in Mesopotamia, before he lived in Haran... ⁸And he gave him the covenant of circumcision. And so Abraham became the father of Isaac, and circumcised him on the eighth day, and Isaac became the father of Jacob, and Jacob of the twelve patriarchs.

- Level 1: Draw Abraham bowing, and then leaving his land.
- Level 2: For what purpose was God seeking a people?
- Level 3: What are some things God gave his people in the Old Testament to aid in understanding their relationship to him?

Tuesday: Acts 7:9-10 “And the patriarchs, jealous of Joseph, sold him into Egypt; but God was with him ¹⁰and rescued him out of all his afflictions and gave him favor and wisdom before Pharaoh, king of Egypt, who made him ruler over Egypt and over all his household.

- Level 1: Draw Joseph leading his family to live in Egypt.
- Level 2: Why did Joseph's brothers sell him into Egypt?
- Level 3: What is the pattern that Joseph begins in this passage?



Wednesday: Acts 7:23-27, 30, 33 “When he was forty years old, it came into his heart to visit his brothers, the children of Israel. ²⁴And seeing one of them being wronged, he defended the oppressed man and avenged him by striking down the Egyptian. ²⁵He supposed that his brothers would understand that God was giving them salvation by his hand, but they did not understand. ²⁶And on the following day he appeared to them as they were quarreling and tried to reconcile them, saying, ‘Men, you are brothers. Why do you wrong each other?’ ²⁷But the man who was wronging his neighbor thrust him aside, saying, ‘Who made you a ruler and a judge over us?...’ ³⁰“Now when forty years had passed, an angel appeared to him in the wilderness of Mount Sinai, in a flame of fire in a bush. ³³Then the Lord said to him, ‘Take off the sandals from your feet, for the place where you are standing is holy ground.

- Level 1: Draw Moses breaking up a fight between two of his people.
- Level 2: What made the place where Moses stood holy?
- Level 3: What implications for the Jewish temple might there be from Stephen pointing out that God appeared to Moses in the wilderness of Mount Sinai, in a bush, and declared the place Holy?

Thursday: Acts 7:39-41 Our fathers refused to obey him, but thrust him aside, and in their hearts they turned to Egypt, ⁴⁰saying to Aaron, ‘Make for us gods who will go before us. As for this Moses who led us out from the land of Egypt, we do not know what has become of him.’ ⁴¹And they made a calf in those days, and offered a sacrifice to the idol and were rejoicing in the works of their hands.

- Level 1: Draw the Israelites bowing before a golden calf.
- Level 2: What was wrong with worshiping the golden calf?
- Level 3: When we are scared or uncertain, why do we have a tendency to “make gods” instead of trusting God?

Friday: Acts 7:47-48, 51-54 But it was Solomon who built a house for him. ⁴⁸Yet the Most High does not dwell in houses made by hands... ⁵¹“You stiff-necked people, uncircumcised in heart and ears, you always resist the Holy Spirit. As your fathers did, so do you. ⁵²Which of the prophets did your fathers not persecute? And they killed those who announced beforehand the coming of the Righteous One, whom you have now betrayed and murdered, ⁵³you who received the law as delivered by angels and did not keep it.” ⁵⁴Now when they heard these things they were enraged, and they ground their teeth at him.

- Level 1: Draw the temple in Jerusalem with arrows pointing upward to heaven to show God is greater than any building.
- Level 2: What are some things people can love more than God? How can our family worship Jesus above comfort, traditions, or safety?
- Level 3: What could be a tradition, a building, or a custom (even good ones) that you would be tempted to challenge even if God himself were he to change it?

Saturday: Acts 8:1-4

- Level 1: Draw men crying while burying Stephen.
- Level 2 & 3: What questions do you have about this passage?
