Sermon Reflections & Activities: Daily questions and activities based on the past week's sermon. Level 1 children can draw, while Level 2 (older children) and Level 3 (teens/adults) discuss the text together.

Worship Song: Prepare for worship by learning one stanza per week, including hand motions for young children.

Memory Verse: A new scripture passage tied to the sermon series every four weeks. Aim to memorize roughly one verse each week.

Luke 15:21-24 “The son said to him, ‘Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.’”²²“But the father said to his servants, ‘Quick! Bring the best robe and put it on him. Put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet.’”²³“Bring the fattened calf and kill it. Let’s have a feast and celebrate.”²⁴“For this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.’ So they began to celebrate.

Weekly Bible Reading: Follow a 3-year chronological plan (5 chapters/week) to build reading habits and align with Sunday School (The Gospel Project) topics.

This Week: **Proverbs 11; Psalms 22, 23,24,25**

Sunday: Acts 4:32a Now the full number of those who believed were of one heart and soul,

- Level 1: Draw a large group of people with one big heart drawn over all of them.
- Level 2: What does it look like for you to treat other Christians like they are part of your family?
- Level 3: Do you actually see the church as “my people,” or do you still think primarily in terms of “my life, my plans, my space”?

Monday: Acts 4:32b and no one said that any of the things that belonged to him was his own, but they had everything in common.

- Level 1: Draw a child handing a toy to another child who is smiling.
- Level 2: What is something you have that is hard to share, and why?
- Level 3: Where in your life are you still quietly saying “mine,” (my money, my time, my home) instead of asking how it could serve others?

Tuesday: Acts 4:33 And with great power the apostles were giving their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all.

- Level 1: Draw people listening closely to someone speaking, with light around them.
- Level 2: How does knowing that Jesus is alive help us to love and help others?
- Level 3: Where does your drive to give come from? Is it from “great grace,” or from guilt, pressure, or habit?



Wednesday: Acts 4:34a There was not a needy person among them,

- Level 1 : Draw one child helping another who is sad and hungry, giving them food.
- Level 2&3: Do you look to meet needs, or do you assume they will find you? Why?

Thursday: Acts 4:34b-35 for as many as were owners of lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold ³⁵and laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need.

- Level 1: Draw two men in a field exchanging money.
- Level 2: What does it feel like to meet the needs of others?
- Level 3: Where might God be calling you not just to give, but to sacrificially say “no” to something you want to make it possible to meet the needs of others?

Friday: Acts 4:36-37 Thus Joseph, who was also called by the apostles Barnabas (which means son of encouragement), a Levite, a native of Cyprus, ³⁷ sold a field that belonged to him and brought the money and laid it at the apostles' feet.

- Level 1: Draw a man putting a bag of gold at other men's feet.
- Level 2: Is there anything you have (money, time, service, encouragement) that you could offer to someone who needs it this week?
- Level 3: Why does Barnabas bring his money to the apostles instead of distributing it himself?

Saturday: Read Luke 14: 12-24

- Level 1: Draw lots of people sitting at a table at a party.
- Level 2&3: What questions do you have about this passage?
